

Managing Notifications

#### Notifications of a POST

When there is an announcement to everyone in that TEAM, this means everyone in that Team receives a notification of that post. A post to everyone is only used to ensure everyone has important information.



Every time someone REPLIES to the announcement, EVERYONE receives a notification from the the person who STARTED the post. So even though Sandra Averill posted once, everyone receives another notification from Sandra Averill every time someone replies to this post. People are getting tired of Sandra Averill, when really, she only posted once!

PLEASE, for every question you have, start a NEW post. Feel free to reply to a person's post, (just never one that begins **TCS**)

### Managing Notifications

#### **Channel Notifications**

There are multiple ways to access and manage notifications. To further customize your notification settings, select your profile picture at the top, right corner of Teams, then select Settings button Settings > Activity button Notifications. From there you can fine-tune what notifications you receive and where those notifications show up.

In Activity on the left side of Teams, select More options More options button on a notification. From the menu, you can mark a notification as read or unread. You can also turn on or off notifications for a specific channel if you want.

Turn off notifications for specific conversations	• • • • • •	-
Go to the beginning of a conversation in a channel, then go to the top right corner of the message and select <b>More</b> <b>options ***</b> > <b>Turn off</b> <b>notifications.</b> Just like muting a chat, turning off notifications to a channel conversation will stop you from receiving updates for that specific conversation. <i>You'll still receive notifications if</i> <i>someone directly mentions you.</i>	Image: Constraint of the second se	> el conversation.
Choose your channel notifications		
Go to a channel that shows in your teams list and select <b>More</b> <b>options</b> > <b>Channel</b> <b>notifications</b> . From there, you can choose what activity you get notifications for, and where they show up. By default, channel mentions are turned off and all new posts will only show in <b>Activity</b> .
